In cooperation between our Office's Children's Rights Unit and the OPCAT Department of National Preventive Mechanism, a conference entitled "Children's Rights from Up Close – the Dimensions of being Vulnerable and the Ways Out" was organized on November 17, 2016.

In cooperation between our Office's Children's Rights Unit and the OPCAT Department of National Preventive Mechanism, a round table conversation was held on the afternoon of the conference. This conversation focused on the experience gained from the investigations of the Ombudsman in child protection institutions as part of his general activities in the promotion of fundamental rights and as an OPCAT national preventive mechanism. In the brief kickoff presentation, Gergely Fliegauf talked about the issues of drug consumption and medicalization in these institutions, then Zsuzsanna Győrffy and Rita Rostás outlined the problems related to the qualifications, further training and supervision of the staff of these children's homes in view of the concrete experience gained from the inquiries. Finally, Linda Nagy-Megyery and Eszter Gilányi talked about child prostitution and the possibilities of taking action against it.
